Yate Community Plan Landscape raised bed on Station Road

Yate Community Plan, with support from Yate Town Council and funding from the South Gloucestershire Council, Safer and Stronger fund, are delighted to have been able to further enhance the Station Road corridor by landscaping the triangular raised bed on the corner of Station Road and Cranleigh Court Road.

A local landscape architect was commissioned and carefully designed a low maintenance planting plan for the unusual shaped bed, to refresh and give it a more modern look.
