1st Yate Beavers

On Thursday 17th October 2019, 1st Yate Beavers visited Poole Court, the home of Yate Town Council, to see a display of the Brinsham Ritz, a Bug Hotel recently built in Brinsham Park.

The Beavers helped build the Brinsham Ritz, positioned by the wildflower meadow and nature reserve, with the guidance of Tim Fairhead, Dodington Parish Councillor Paul Hulbert and Ian Dove - all members of the Avon Wildlife Trust Southwold group.



The display in Poole Court showed design drawings by the Beavers and photographs taken when it was being built, along with a miniature version of The Brinsham Ritz. The group was delighted to meet Town Councillors and local chainsaw artist Andy O Neill who has since created a spectacular sign which is now attached to The Brinsham Ritz.

Councillor Karl Tomasin, Mayor and Chair of Yate Town Council, conducted a mini meeting in the Council Chamber with the beavers who took places at the table, banged the Council gavel and made suggestions of how Yate could be improved.

Councillor Tomasin commented: "It was a pleasure to welcome the beavers of 1st Yate to Poole Court last week and to see the wonderful displays of their brilliant work on the building of the Bug hotel at Brinsham Park this summer.

It was fantastic to be able to invite the young beavers and their leaders into the council chamber and talk about what's involved in being a councillor and what we do in here in Yate. It was also interesting to hear what exciting ideas they had about Yate and how they would

like to enhance the town and it's public open spaces, given half a chance!"

Councillor Chris Willmore organised a very successful treasure hunt, around the ground floor of the building with certificates for all the winners.

Howard Lewis Play Area

Yate Town Council was excited to announce the refurbishment of the Howard Lewis Play Area began on Monday 21st October 2019.

Weather permitting, the project should take around 4 weeks to complete.

The play area has been fenced off but access to the path and tennis court has remained open.

Following a consultation and feedback from local people, a number of



enhancements have been added to the play area. These include replacing the tyre swing with a basket swing, the inclusion of a trampoline, new roundabout and various timber balance beams and equipment.

Yate Town Council successfully bid for s106 money and were awarded £49,628 for these enhancements at Howard Lewis.
