Yate Outdoor Sports Complex Celebration

On Sunday 15th September 2019, Yate Town Council celebrated the completion of two major projects carried out at Yate Outdoor Sports Complex; the refurbished track and athletics facilities as well as the newly replaced astroturf all-weather pitch.

Councillors were joined by representatives of YOSC Ltd, local users, stakeholders and also Charles Berkeley, High Sheriff of Gloucestershire.



Everyone expressed delight at the newly refurbished and upgraded facilities, bringing YOSC up to a highly competitive standard.

The refurbishment of the track and athletics facilities was made possible with funding from Yate Town Council, South Gloucestershire Council s106 monies and Sport England, while the Astroturf replacement project was funded by Yate Town Council, Sport England, Ibstock & Entrust Communities and Suez Landfill Community Trust.

Councillor Karl Tomasin, Chair of Yate Town Council, commented:

"I'm very proud and delighted that at YOSC we now have a refurbished track and athletics facilities and newly replaced astroturf all-weather pitch.

We now have a top-class sports complex for our community to use, compete and excel on.

It was wonderful to see so many people taking the opportunity to use the facilities here on Sunday and it's great that it will be here for many more years to come."

The official opening took place on the morning of an Avon Track and Field event, hockey matches, and Yate Rugby Tots training, demonstrating how well used the site is.

YOSC is a multisport site including athletics facilities, running track, grass pitches and a sand-based Astroturf pitch adjacent to Brimsham Green School in North Yate. Please see the YOSC website for more details.

Boxing and Community Building

Yate Town Council (YTC) has been working with Yate Amateur Boxing Club (YABC) for the last 18 months to re-home them in purpose-built premises onsite at Yate Outdoor Sports Complex, home to an athletics and track facility, astroturf pitch, football and rugby pitches.



YABC is currently homed in a portacabin with no heating, deteriorating equipment and with premises that are too small to accommodate both male and female boxers and not suitable for para-boxers. South Gloucestershire Council deemed the current building unfit-for-purpose and advised of its intention to demolish it in the very near future.

The Town Council now has planning permission and is seeking a loan from the Public Works Loan Board for the project, as well as continuing to work with YABC to source funds for the rebuild. The new community building will provide more space and storage. Male, female and disabled changing facilities and toilets will be available onsite at YOSC, encouraging female and para boxers to start attending the club.
